Re: Curry County Board of Commissioners Support for the Southwestern Oregon Watershed and Salmon Protection Act (H.R. 980)

Dear Senator Wyden, Senator Merkley, and Congressman DeFazio,

At our Dec. 1, 2021, meeting, the Curry County Board of Commissioners voted unanimously to express strong support for the Southwestern Oregon Watershed and Salmon Protection Act. This Act will help safeguard the headwaters of several of our local wild rivers and salmon streams from the threat of nickel strip mining by making the 2016 Southwestern Oregon Mineral Withdrawal permanent.

Headwaters to be protected include those of both the Wild & Scenic Illinois River, which flows into our nationally renowned Wild & Scenic Rogue River, and also the Wild & Scenic North Fork Smith in Oregon, which ultimately flows down through Redwood National Park south of our state line. The headwaters of Hunter Creek and Pistol River, two locally beloved salmon streams, are also included. Protecting the unique values of these watersheds is a high priority for us and for our citizens.

We in Curry County are very proud of our outstanding Wild and Scenic rivers and salmon streams that flow from the rugged mountains into the Pacific Ocean. The rivers of our "Wild Rivers Coast" region are national treasures cherished for their clear emerald-tinted water, world-class fisheries, and many outstanding opportunities for recreation. They are also important to our local South Coast economy, with sport fisheries alone drawing tens of thousands of anglers and accounting for millions of dollars each year. The rivers also provide pure drinking water for our residents and are a big part of our rural way of life. For all these reasons, our City of Gold Beach, plus many local tourism-oriented businesses, local civic and conservations organizations, and concerned residents and anglers have supported protecting the headwaters of our rivers from the irrevocable risks associated with strip mining. Curry County wants a clean water economy into the future.

The 2016 temporary withdrawal was intended to give Congress time to pass this law and has already been in effect for five years. We are aware that the Southwestern Oregon Watershed and Salmon Protection Act has been introduced in every session since 2015 but has not yet passed. We strongly urge you to work together with your colleagues in Washington D.C. to do all that you can to move this legislation across the finish line in a timely manner to help ensure the conservation of Curry County's wild rivers, salmon, and clean water into the future.
