Dear Senators Merkley and Wyden:

Over the last eight years, the Del Norte County Board of Supervisors has voted consistently to oppose potential strip mining in the headwaters of the North Fork Smith River. Therefore, we are pleased to strongly support legislation to expand the Smith River National Recreation Area and as well as legislation which provides a permanent mineral withdrawal (ban on new mining claims) for 101,021-acre headwaters areas of the North Fork Smith River and its tributaries, Rough & Ready Creek, Hunter Creek, and the Pistol River.

In 2014, the Del Norte County Board of Supervisors (Board) voted unanimously to oppose the issuance of a limited water use license for Red Flat Nickel Corporation's Cleopatra Check Drilling Program based on the potential to cause significant adverse environmental impacts within the overall watershed of the Smith River and subsequent impacts on drinking water. This was followed by the Board's letter of support for State Senator McGuire's Smith River Watershed Protection Resolution (SJR-3), approved by the State Assembly and Senate in July 2015, urging the President of the United States and Congress to safeguard the North Fork Smith River. Later that year and again in 2016, the Board wrote in support for a permanent mineral withdrawal as provided by H.R. 980 and S. 1538.

Thank you for your leadership on this legislation. The Smith River is a primary water supply for our communities and it's also a world class attraction and centerpiece to our travel and tourism-based economy.

Several years ago when a foreign mining company applied to the OR Water Resources Dept. for a limited water license to explore strip mining for nickel and other metals in the headwaters of the North Fork of the Smith, our water supply agencies swiftly responded in opposition.

I wanted to thank you for your efforts regarding the North Fork of the Smith River watershed in Oregon, which is within my Oregon Legislative District and the headwaters of the Smith River in Oregon.

The Smith River is an important watershed in Southern Oregon and Northern California, providing critical salmonid habitat, drinking water and recreational opportunities. Much of these benefits are linked to the Smith River in Oregon, within the Kalmiopsis Wilderness. The U.S. Forest Service's North Fork Smith River Watershed Analysis states in part, "The North Fork of the Smith River watershed provides near-pristine spawning and rearing habitat for a highly productive fishery ... Fall chinook, Klamath Mountain Province steelhead, anadromous cutthroat trout, resident rainbow and cutthroat trout use the watershed. The watershed appears to be an exceptional producer of anadromous cutthroat trout."

As you are aware, in July of 2017, the State of Oregon designated, not only the mainstem of the North Fork of the Smith River, but all its tributaries and associated wetlands, an Outstanding Resource Waters. These designations clearly outline Oregon's commitment to the importance of the North Fork of the Smith River watershed and its tributaries to Oregonians and Californians alike.



The Smith River National Recreation Area Expansion Act

Cosponsors: Senators Wyden, Feinstein and Padilla

Background

In 1990, Congress enacted legislation to establish the Smith River National Recreation Area (NRA) that protected the Smith River watershed in California. Unfortunately, the boundary of the NRA stopped at the Oregon border, leaving the North Fork of the Smith River and its tributaries, unprotected. The Smith River National Recreation Area Expansion Act expands the NRA to include 58,000 acres of the North Fork Smith River watershed including tributaries which contain coho and Chinook salmon, and Coastal Cutthroat trout.

The Smith River is home to a rich life forms – from the diverse Siskiyou Mountains forests to unique plants found nowhere else on earth to ancient, towering redwoods along the lower river. The Smith River NRA offers exceptional recreational activities, including water sports, fishing, hunting, camping, and sightseeing because the scenic beauty, world class fisheries, exceptional water quality, and abundant wildlife.

Elements of the Legislation

- Boundary Adjustment: The legislation would adjust the NRA boundaries to add approximately 58,000 acres of the North Fork Smith watershed in Oregon to the Smith River NRA.
- Permanent Mineral Withdrawal: The legislation would protect all land located inside the National Recreation Area by permanently withdrawing them from new mining claims, helping protect this sensitive area from proposed nickel strip mines.
- Wild and Scenic River Protection: The legislation would designate 75.22 river miles of wild and scenic rivers, including Baldface Creek, Chrome Creek and nearby streams.
- Recreation Planning: The legislation would direct the U.S. Forest Service to prepare an updated recreation plan to reflect the expansion of the recreation area into Oregon.
- A Special Study: The legislation would require a special study of streams, fens, wetlands and potentially unstable and vulnerable aquatic habitat areas.
- Wildfire Management: The legislation would continue to allow the Secretary to continue (in cooperation with other Federal, State, and local agencies, as appropriate) to conduct wildland fire operations within the recreation area, consistent with the purposes of this Act.
- Travel Management Plans: The legislation makes no changes to completed Travel Management Plans on both the Smith River NRA and in the Rogue River-Siskiyou National Forest where the expansion will occur.
