## Land Use Permit Is Required to Operate A Vacation Rental in Curry County

- A land use permit is now required to advertise or operate a vacation rental in the unincorporated areas of Curry County. This does not include areas within the city limits of Brookings, Gold Beach or Port Orford.
- The Curry County Board of Commissioners adopted requirements for vacation rentals due to the increasing concerns from citizens and neighborhoods experiencing negative impacts from vacation rentals.
- Permit applications for vacation rentals will be accepted beginning September 7, 2022. Application
  materials can be obtained from the Curry County Planning web site
  (www.co.curry.or.us/departments/community development department/planning division.php)
  or from the Planning/Building office located at 94235 Moore Street, Ste. 113 in Gold Beach.
- Existing vacation rentals on lands zoned as Residential and Light Commercial (RR-2, RR-5, RR-10, R1, R2, R3, RCR, RC and C-1) shall have a land use permit by March 31, 2023. Operating or advertising an existing vacation rental without a land use permit after March 31, 2023, will result in an Enforcement Action and may prohibit the dwelling from being used as a vacation rental.
- Operating or advertising a new vacation rental after September 7, 2022 without a land use permit
  will result in an Enforcement Action and may prohibit the dwelling from being used as a vacation
  rental in the future.
- An existing vacation rental cannot be grandfathered. It cannot be allowed without a land use permit as a non-conforming use.
- <u>Vacation Rental</u> A vacation rental is a lawfully established dwelling unit, or portion of a dwelling unit, that is rented to any person or entity for lodging or residential purposes, for a period of up to (30) consecutive nights.
- The Curry County Board of Commissioners will consider putting a cap on the number of vacation rentals allowed in the near future.
