<p>In this phase, all students will participate in Distance Learning, due to orders from the state or local public health department.</p> <p>Pursuant to Budget Trailer Bill AB-77, Distance Learning must include the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Equipment and ability to connect to the internet</li> <li>- Grade level, standards based content that is "substantially equivalent" to in-person instruction</li> <li>- Academic and other supports</li> <li>- Special education services as provided in the individualized education plan</li> <li>- Designated and integrated instruction for English learners</li> <li>- Daily live interaction with certificated employees and peers for purposes of instruction, progress monitoring, and maintaining school connectedness</li> <li>- "Adequate" meals</li> </ul>	<p>In this phase, all students will participate in Distance Learning, but small, consistent cohorts of students may be able to receive in-person instruction specific to their educational needs.</p> <p>Student groups may include, but are not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- English learners</li> <li>- Students receiving special education services</li> <li>- Students receiving mental health related services per an IEP, 504, SST or SARB agreement</li> <li>- Academic intervention</li> </ul>	<p>In this phase, all students would participate in-person and engage in other learning and work while not physically at school.</p> <p>In cohorts not to exceed 50% of the total class, students would receive, at a minimum, instruction from a certificated teacher in English and mathematics (K-8) and other content areas, potentially, in 7-12.</p> <p>Participation in class would be supported by additional grade level, content based learning and work, which would be done while students were not attending class in-person.</p> <p><i>* Distance Learning would be an option for those selecting it.</i></p>	<p>In this phase, all students would return to school for a full day, five days per week.</p> <p>NOTE: This phase may be marked by continued preventative measures, which may include separated recesses, modified lunch schedules, etc.</p> <p><i>*Distance Learning would be an option for those selecting it.</i></p>

**Phases 2-4 would include continued emphasis on handwashing, PPE and physical distancing, as directed by public health.**
